Review

What are the school reviewing?

Targets 1-3 at the beginning of this plan.

How does the School assess the outcomes?

The school has a clear Monitoring & Evaluation cycle where leaders assess the curriculum. They gather a wide range of evidence through pupil interviews, lesson observations, interviews with staff, the performance management cycle and data collected from activities. In addition, The Beeches Primary School is assessed for The Sports Mark.

Have the outcomes been achieved?

- 1) **Yes.** All pupils attending The Beeches Primary School have access to high quality teaching through the broad and balanced curriculum that will allow them to develop their sporting skills. Monitoring and Evaluation cycles indicate that pupil's social and emotional well-being continues to improve and other aspects of 'health', including mental health, are advancing.
- 2) **Yes.** Pupils have greater access to school sport, or extra-curricular opportunities. Their skills, awareness and understanding is developing, and their opportunities to participate in elite or intra school activities have increased. The school has taken part in range of competition and enjoyed success (competition winners or runners-up) in cricket, football and dance.
- 3) **Yes.** The number of pupils using sport to develop language, leadership and management skills by being exposed to 'real life' opportunities to organise, lead and manage events has greatly increased with the number of events organised this year. Further opportunities have been given through the new 'House Teams'.

Additional Judgements

- The School has been given a provision Gold Mark for sport by The Sports Games in recognition for the excellent work achieved this year. This is an increase from Bronze.
- The School has maintained the broad range of extra-curricular opportunities for pupils.
- The range of interschool activities has greatly increased as part of the Core Values initiatives
- Major improvements to assessment are evident. Pupils progress and development is well monitored and maintained.
