Maths


In maths, we will be learning multiplication and division.


Young Voices



Reading

In Reading, we will be reading a wide range of texts including fiction, non-fiction and poetry. We will be using our pre-reading skills to understand the text better.

Also this half-term	
Science	This half-term we will be learning about how to classify living things. The children will know living things can be grouped in a variety of ways and that different animals are a part of different food chains. They will specifically know that living things can be a producer, predator or prey and that animals can be grouped into vertebrates and invertebrates.
History	In the coming weeks, the children will learn about Boudicca's revolt against the Romans. We expect the children to know the story of Boudicca's revolt against the Romans, how the Romans built many roads in Britannia, including Watling Street and where the legions were stationed across Britannia to keep order.
Geography	In another action-packed series of lessons, we want the children to understand coastal processes and landforms. We will specifically learn to understand the processes of erosion, transportation & deposition and gain an overview of the Jurassic coast, including significance of its rocks, fossils and landforms. We will also continue to study close to home with more lesson on Wales.
Religious Education	We will continue to explore Christianity themes, looking at the life of Jesus. We will explore how Christian believe Jesus was baptised and tempted.
Music	To begin this half-term, we will be listening to traditional vs modern sea shanties. We will use and play a steady beat as well as discussing the history and origin of songs.
PSHE	This half-term, we will learn about online relationships. We want the children to know the rules and principles for keeping safe online, how to recognise risks, harmful content and contact, and how to report them. We also will be teaching the importance of where and how to report concerns and get support with issues online.
