Summary of Pupil Premium Grant Spending 2019 – 2020

Aims and objectives 2019-2020:

- i) To use interventions such as Pixl therapy groups to diminish the difference in the attainment and boost the progress of PPG pupils.**
- ii) To use Booster teachers in order to address misconceptions and gaps in learning in core skills in a smaller group setting.**
- iii) Ensure fair and equitable access to a rich menu of educational visits, sport and music opportunities.**
- iv) Provide curriculum development and training for class teachers to promote the engagement in learning for all and for vulnerable pupils and those experiencing deprivation.**
- v) Continue to develop and improve attendance and parental involvement for vulnerable pupils and those experiencing deprivation.**

Pixl therapy groups (During School Hours)	£6960.99	Children in Reading / Writing (inc ALL PP pupils) and Y6 pupils in Maths have the opportunity to receive short term 1 to 1 tuition and small group boosters sessions according to individual need in Reading, Mathematics and Writing to cover gaps missed in their education or to address misconceptions.

Subsidised Curriculum Trips and Activities	£2075.46	PP children in each year group take part in a wide range of educational visits outside school, including the offer of residentials, activities and visits within the school to support learning across the curriculum. PPG pupils are fully funded according to family need. All pupil costs capped to ensure fairness to all families. Opportunities focused on experiences not usually available locally or new to most children.	
Subsidised Clubs	£2430.60	PP children and families have access to a rich menu of activities outside the school day, from 8am until 4.30pm. PPG pupils are fully funded according to family needs. All pupil costs capped to ensure fairness to all families. Opportunities focused on those new to most children. Over 475 minutes of Sports Clubs are offered in school per week, and a further 565 minutes of other curriculum clubs.	
Training for staff	£5155.56	The school participates in local and national networks to provide high quality training for school leaders and teachers in curriculum development and 'narrowing the gap' in achievement and progress between vulnerable learners and others. Pixl training is specifically designed to look closely at the most vulnerable pupils, many of whom are eligible for PP. Staff will be training to deliver small theory sessions aimed at diminishing the difference,	
Attendance, Family and social inclusion workers	£35272.52	Vulnerable children and families are supported through parenting groups, meetings with local agencies, supporting admissions and meeting with teacher to discuss progress and ways to help children learn at home. Attendance is improved. Families of Roma PP pupils are supported.	
Sensory Circuit	£2470.04	PP children with additional sensory needs have a daily session to prepare them to access the school curriculum.	
Peer Mentoring	£819.29	Y5/6 Trained mentors to work closely with PP children to improve their times tables, reading and general well-being.

Now Press Play	£2134	Now Press Play is an immersive audio resource that engages primary school children in the curriculum through emotion, imagination and movement. In a now>press>play Experience every child is given a pair of wireless headphones. Immersed in sound, they become the main character in a story, meeting people, discovering places and solving problems on an educational adventure they'll never forget.	

		Now Press Play will be used as a whole class activity or with smaller groups (PP) for intervention work. It is a fun and inclusive way to engage children in the curriculum.
