- iii) Ensure fair and equitable access to a rich menu of educational visits, sport and music opportunities.
- iv) Provide curriculum development and training for class teachers to promote the engagement in learning for all and for vulnerable pupils and those experiencing deprivation.
- v) Continue to develop and improve attendance and parental involvement for vulnerable pupils and those experiencing deprivation.
