How We Used the Funding

- Improve the quality of PE teaching through professional development for staff.
- Provide specialist coaching alongside teachers to develop sustainable expertise.
- Offer a wide range of extra-curricular sporting opportunities.
- Increase participation in physical activity throughout the school.
- Improve access to sport for disadvantaged pupils.
- Develop inclusive sporting opportunities for pupils with SEND.
- Encourage greater participation by girls in PE and school sport.
- Purchase resources to support high-quality PE lessons.

Impact

- Improved teachers' confidence and expertise in delivering high-quality PE.

- Provided a broader range of sporting clubs and physical activities.
- Increased opportunities for competitive and inclusive sport.
- Supported pupils with SEND through targeted physical activity.
- Ensured disadvantaged pupils can access sporting opportunities.
- Continued to develop a culture where physical activity forms an important part of school life.

By investing significantly in staff development, the benefits of the funding will continue beyond a single academic year and strengthen PE provision for future cohorts of pupils.

Swimming

Measure	Percentage
Swim 25 metres confidently	42%
Use a range of strokes effectively	39%
Perform safe self-rescue	39%

The school recognises that these outcomes are below national expectations. A significant local challenge is the limited availability of public swimming facilities. In our locality, access to public swimming lessons is largely limited until the seasonal lido opens during the summer months, reducing opportunities for pupils to practise and consolidate their swimming skills outside of school. We will continue to maximise curriculum swimming opportunities and work with local providers to improve outcomes.

Priorities for 2026–2027

- Continue to develop staff expertise through high-quality professional development.
- Increase opportunities for all pupils to participate in competitive and inclusive sport.
- Further promote physical activity throughout the school day.
- Continue to remove barriers for disadvantaged pupils and pupils with SEND.
- Seek opportunities to improve swimming outcomes where local provision allows.
