### **Review Commentary**

Each target has been reviewed in its own right,

General: Sport at The Beeches continues to improve year on year. The range of activities available has increased and the quality of teaching is high. Pupils enjoy lessons, clubs and events and are becoming increasingly more aware of the benefits of health and fitness. The school enters more competitions and events than almost all schools locally.

In pupil voice surveys, PE is the most popular subject by some distance. These figures show that boys and girls are equally engaged. The wide range of opportunities has led to many elite performance opportunities in Cricket, Football and Gymnastics. A year 5 pupil graduated to the Peterborough United Academy this year.

During the 2019/2020 academic year, the school will aim to build on these successes, maintain high standards and increase the number of initiatives that further improve the mental wellbeing of pupils.
